#### FOR NOT FOR ETHOS

Extending the spirit of Vijaybhoomi of creating a liberal mindset and fostering confidence in expressing oneself freely, comes For Not For, to get the youth across an international forum to ponder, seek, discuss and debate issues of international interest with robust civility, regardless of frontiers. FOR NOT FOR, a debate competition, designed on an international framework is an annual event. For Not For 2022, the third edition brought together 110 participants from over 100 national and international schools, eminent judges like Principals, Senior Academicians, Media, Toastmasters, and Corporates and was the first-ever International online high school debate, hosted by a university in India.

#### **FNF OBJECTIVES**

- 1. To encourage liberal, free expression of thought by the youth through an online medium.
- 2. To let the youth of tomorrow's world come together to deliberate on mutual concern areas like poverty, hunger, unemployment, health, and gender equality which are SDGs.
- 3. To enhance 21st century critical skills like communication skills, critical thinking and problem solving required to generate global solutions.
- 4. To build awareness on liberal education that creates T shaped professionals for Industry 4.0.

#### **FOR NOT FOR 2022**

The competition grew in 2022 in terms of scale. We had a competition in a hybrid model with 272 students from 6 countries. The preliminaries were virtual but the pre quarters, quarters, semi and finals were at the beautiful campus of Vijaybhoomi University at Karjat. 64 students experienced a Leadership Retreat for three days and powered up their skills in innovation, entrepreneurship, music, art and also took part in outdoor events like sports and trekking.

Eminent judges including Lawyers, Debate Winners, Journalists and Content writers followed defined judging parameters and gave individual feedback to every participant.

FNF 2023 is proud to launch two categories of competition:

JUNIOR: FOR GRADE 9TH AND 10TH | SENIOR: FOR GRADE 11TH AND 12TH

FNF 2023 will have two competitions for different grades, Junior and Senior following the same format, which is a hybrid model in the British Parliamentary Debate format. The debate rounds will be between 14th October and 5th November with a Virtual Preliminary and Pre- Quarter round and the Quarters, Semi and Final Rounds on 4th and 5th November as a part of an Offline Leadership Retreat at our Vijaybhoomi campus in Karjat.

#### **YOUTH 20**

Youth 20 (Y20) is an official consultation forum for youth from all G20 member countries to be able to dialogue with each other. Y20 encourages youth as future leaders to raise awareness of global issues, exchange ideas, argue, negotiate, and reach consensus. #### BRITISH PARLIAMENTARY DEBATE FORMAT

FNF 2023 debating rounds will follow the British Parliamentary Style Debate. This style of debating is one of the more popular forms, based on debates in the British Parliament. It was first adopted by UK universities but is now popular in debating competitions around the world. Much like in the House of Commons, the debate is split into two opposing sides: the proposition (or government), and the opposition. Each side is then further divided into 'opening' and 'closing' teams, all four of which have two speakers. These are named after their equivalent positions in the British Parliament.

#### SKILL BUILDING WORKSHOPS

FNF 2023 brings to you debating and a lot more. Skills to make you a leader of the 21st Century, a leader with strong persuasive skills, adept at critical thinking, innovation, keen sense of creativity and out of the box views. FNF, as in the past, will help you build these vital skills in a variety of platforms.

#### LEADERSHIP RETREAT

Tucked in between the majestic valleys of Karjat, VijayBhoomi University is the perfect location to grow one's life skills, gearing them up for future endeavors. For Not For 2023, aims to offer more than just a parliamentary debate competition. Coupled with the intense final rounds of the debate, participants who qualify for the Quarters will be given the unprecedented opportunity to attend the Leadership Retreat at VU. Participants will be able to experience many activities ranging from a fun networking event to workshops on specialized domains like entrepreneurship, design, music, business to an awe-inducing trek of the Karjat hills. Each event adds its own life skill as a valued outcome.

### HYBRID BRITISH PARLIAMENTARY DEBATE PARTICIPANTS ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Registration can be done by the School authority as well as students. Both students will need to be from the same school and within the competition grade category
- 2. A team comprises 2 students from each school.
- 3. Junior Competition Standard 9, 10; Senior Competition Standard 11, 12
- 4. Students who are registering for the Hybrid British Parliamentary Debate competition must be prepared to travel to the Vijaybhoomi University campus in Karjat, Maharashtra for the Quarter, Semi and Final rounds.
- 5. If the team qualifies for the rounds at Vijaybhoomi, they can be accompanied by their school teacher.

## HYBRID BRITISH PARLIAMENTARY DEBATE PRE-ROUND

- 1. Topics of G20 interest will be shared with the participating students two days before the debate for the Preliminary round and Quarter round
- 2. Students will prepare both sides of the argument for both topics.
- 3. Topics for the Quarter, Semi Final and Final will be shared an hour before the debate.
- 4. The pairing and allotment of students will be done by the organizers in a random and fair manner.



# HYBRID BRITISH PARLIAMENTARY DEBATE FRAMEWORK

- British Parliamentary Debate Format
- Each speaker will speak for a total of 5 minutes.
- 1-3-Judge panel and one moderator for each round Vijaybhoomi Coordinator for queries
- Participant mentoring by Vijaybhoomi faculty (optional) Technology familiarization session

- Deputy Prime Minister (Opening Government) 5 min
- Deputy Leader of the Opposition (Opening Opposition) 5 min
- Member of Government (Closing Government) 5 min
- Member of the Opposition (Closing Opposition)5 min
- Government Whip (Closing Government) 5 min
- Opposition Whip (Closing Opposition) 5 min

#### **HYBRID BRITISH PARLIAMENTARY PROCESS**

- 1. Everyone should log in at least 15 minutes before the scheduled start time for their preliminary or quarter rounds. This will allow the judges and the participants to informally meet each other. It is also an opportunity to make sure the participants are visible and audible.
- 2. The moderator welcomes everyone, asks debaters to introduce themselves, introduces the judges, and welcomes any audience to the debate.
- 3. After the preliminary rounds are over, the convener will request the judges to deliberate in a breakout room. They will discuss briefly and come to a quick decision. The results will be communicated the next day via email and WhatsApp.



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
